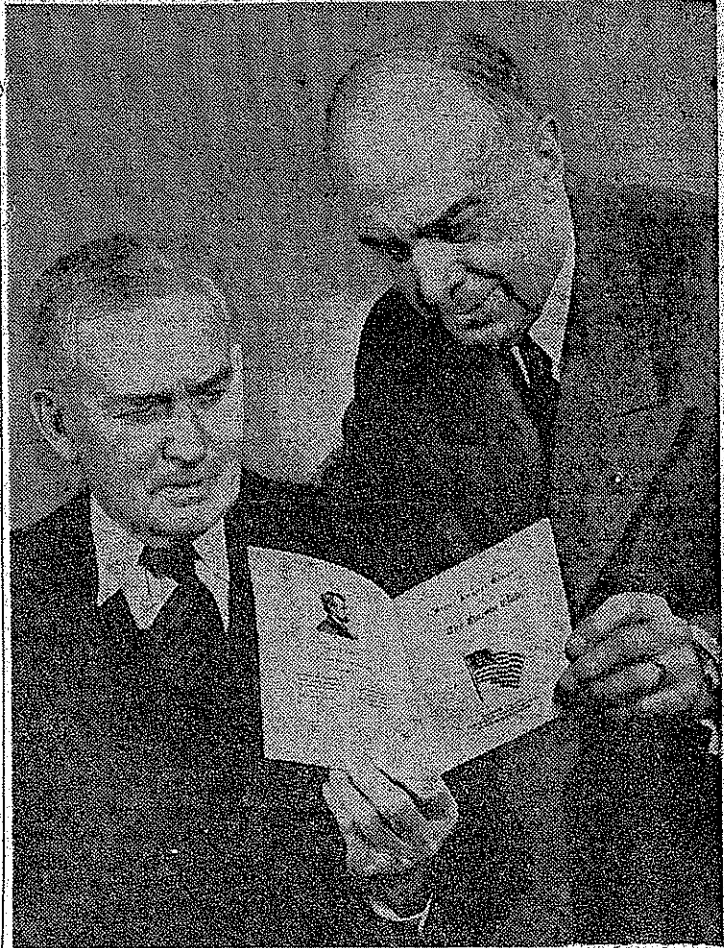


Original Lincoln Program

Lincoln Club Dinner Set On Saturday

An estimated 500 Colorado Republicans are expected to attend the 37th annual Lincoln Club banquet at the Denver Dry Goods Co. diningroom Saturday night.

Featured speaker will be Senator Millikin (R) of Colo.

Included in the group attending will be the only two surviving members of the original group which founded the Denver Lincoln Club in 1918. They are George A. Luxford, 1036 Marion St., former supreme court justice, and Roy G. Munroe of 2351 Glencoe St., an officer of the Colorado Public Service Co.

Purpose of the banquet is to mark Lincoln's birthday Feb. 12. It also is Millikin's birthday. The function was delayed until Saturday, however, to accommodate Millikin's congressional schedule.
